### **EDITORIAL**

# **Reader's Digest Gospel**

Reader's Digest is a periodical magazine whose claim to fame is taking an author's work and compressing it so that it is a quicker read, cutting out what it considers to be unnecessary words. The famous Thomas Jefferson from our own American history, used scissors and paste to edit and produce his rendition of a Reader's Digest version of the Bible. He removed all of the statements he thought were unnecessary. Using the King James Version of 1611, Jefferson assumed the role of inspiration and cut out from the Gospels any reference to the supernatural which included the Godhead and miracles. He retained only the basic teachings of Jesus, claiming the rest was inserted by over-imaginative clergy.

According to Jefferson, there was no virgin birth. No healing the sick. No raising the dead. No calming the seas. No earthquake and opened tombs at His death. No resurrection and ascension. He was not the Son of God; just a man whom he equated with Socrates. I don't know why Jefferson did it. Perhaps he couldn't deal with the real Jesus. Maybe he could not handle that which could not be easily explained. Who knows for sure?

But then, who knows why so many of us do the same thing today? I don't mean folks are literally cutting and pasting the Scriptures. But it is practically the same thing. Sometimes they even claim to be Christians. Thomas did. Let me explain.

Jesus said, "If you want to be mine you must renounce all you have" (Luke 14:33). Many today say that was an exaggeration. He said, "If you are going to follow me, you must be totally committed" (Luke 9:62). Some today contend all you need to do is come to church next Sunday. Jesus said, "Stop and take the time and expense to help others" (Luke 10:30ff). Today we often say, "Help if you're not in a hurry or don't have something else to do." Jesus said, "Tell others about me so they can be saved" (Matthew 28:19). Some today lessen that responsibility by saying it is sufficient to just be a good example. Jesus said, "Your traditions void God's Word and make your worship vain" (Mark 7:1-13). People today say, "Tradition is fine. Go to the church of your choice. Truth is of little importance." Jesus said, "To be saved, you must believe in me and be baptized" (Mark 16:16). Many today twist and turn that truth and say, "Baptism is not necessary. It is just a meaningless ritual."

When will we ever learn that we cannot "cut and paste" the words of Jesus to suit ourselves? We must adhere to the words of Christ. *All of them!* Even if we don't like them. Why? Because they are *His* words. And *His* words are what will save us or condemn us (John 12:48).
