EDITORIAL

Evangelism Ideas

I have had some very good instructors that have taught evangelism. I've also had some very good evangelist struggle to teach others how to do it. To be honest, I have found at times the difficulty in turning a casual conversation into a Bible study. This is something many people in the church struggle with. So, I felt it important to share some good ideas on better evangelism. I hope all of us will put these ideas into practice, for when it comes to evangelizing the lost, practice does help us to become better equipped at doing it.

- **#1: Pray.** Every morning as we leave from our homes, we should pray that God gives us an opportunity to talk about Jesus. And we should pray also for the boldness to do so. (Acts 4:29; Ephesians 6:19-20)
- **#2: Invite.** Who would you like to see coming to the church assembly? Invite one person to attend. And always offer guests to sit with you, both in class and in worship. If you didn't invite a guest but see someone you don't know, invite them to sit with you and your family. (1 Thessalonians 2:8)
- **#3: Act.** Do an act of service (such as babysitting, lawn care, etc.) each week or month as an inroad to developing a Bible study. Also, serve just to serve, not as a means to an end. People are turned off when they see an "act of service" as a way to gain an advantage over someone. (Matthew 20:28)
- **#4 Ask.** We will never know whether someone has an interest in studying the Bible with us until we ask. Living and Speaking the Truth in Love Consistently is the way to show our Christian genuineness. Be patient and wait for hearts to open, but be available when someone says they're interested. (Ephesians 4:15)
- **#5: Build.** Build relationships and then use them to lead people to Christ. Humbly and gently love people. Identify with the burdens they may bear and offer to share their load. And pray for them, by name, every day. (John 1:45-46).

I will share more ideas in the coming months. But let me add for now that our attitudes play a role in evangelism. If we act like we have all the answers and our attitude is one of arrogance, we are not acting like Jesus. Instead, allow yourself to become a fellow Truth Seeker. Don't tell people what the Bible says, let the Scriptures speak while we remain silent. Evangelism is meant to be two Truth-Seekers on a journey together. It is one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread. If we keep it simplistic like this, we can correctly remove ourselves from the process and allow God through the Holy Spirit, actually do the work. May God bless our efforts for His Kingdom.

SERMON NOTES

Fulfilled (Part 2)

A group of behavioral economists did an interesting study. They created a test where people were encouraged to cheat and by doing so they could make more money by answering more questions correctly. They then divided the participants into two groups. One group, before taking the test, had to write down all the Ten Commandments they could remember. The other group, just had to write down recent movies they had seen. When they took the test, the group that had to write down the Ten Commandments beforehand BY FAR, cheated much less than the other group, even though many claimed not to be particularly religious. My assessment? When people are confronted with an ethical standard, their behavior seems to change, whereas if one does not have integrity on the brain, it seems ethics are up for sale. Jesus challenges us in this next passage of the SOTM for a deep, all-encompassing integrity, that does not sway with circumstances.

Cuando tomaron la prueba, el grupo que tuvo que escribir los Diez Mandamientos de antemano, CON MUCHO, hizo muchas menos trampas que el otro grupo, a pesar de que muchos afirmaron no ser particularmente religiosos. ¿Mi valoración? Cuando las personas se enfrentan a una norma ética, su comportamiento parece cambiar, mientras que si uno no tiene integridad en el cerebro, parece que la ética está a la venta. Jesús nos desafía en el próximo pasaje del S.D.M. a una integridad profunda, que lo abarca todo, que no se deja llevar por las circunstancias.
