

Book Review: Asking Better Questions of the Bible by Marty Solomon

Marty Solomon's Asking Better Questions of the Bible is a refreshing and transformative read that invites readers into a deeper, more nuanced engagement with Scripture. Far from a dry academic exercise, this book feels like a conversation with a wise and compassionate guide, one who understands the wounds, doubts, and longings many bring to the biblical text.



What Makes It Stand Out

- Solomon challenges readers to move beyond surface-level interpretations and instead ask the kinds of questions the Bible itself is prompting.
- He explores the unique literary structures and cultural contexts of different biblical genres—from the Torah to the Gospels—making each section feel like a new discovery.
- The book emphasizes that doubt and curiosity aren't threats to faith but pathways to deeper understanding and intimacy with God.

Perspective-Shifting Insights

- Readers are encouraged to consider the ancient Near Eastern worldview, which reshapes how we understand concepts like truth, sin, and eternal life.
- Solomon's approach helps dismantle rigid dogma and opens space for mystery, humility, and awe.
- His background as host of The BEMA Podcast adds a layer of practical wisdom and storytelling that makes complex ideas accessible.

Final Thoughts: This isn't just a book; it's an invitation to grow. Whether you're a seasoned theologian or someone wrestling with faith, *Asking Better Questions of the Bible* will challenge your assumptions and deepen your appreciation for Scripture's richness. It's a great read that doesn't just inform, it transforms.


