SERMON NOTES

Where the Christmas Story Should Begin Assorted Scriptures

The focus of much of the Christian world today and the days and weeks before now has been on the birth of a baby in a manger whose name would be called *Immanuel*, meaning *God with us*. And it's a beautiful story which touches the heart and should be told, and told often. But the Christmas story really should not begin there. Today we will take a journey through the Scriptures with very little comment starting where the Christmas story should begin.

EDITORIAL

And There Were Shepherds

"And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night" (Luke 2:8). This was the scene when the announcement came that the Good Shepherd had been born in Bethlehem. The Shepherd model of leadership in God's kingdom has been the predominant one since the very beginning. Yet it is often the one least emphasized in many quarters of the Kingdom today. We are more comfortable waiting on tables than we are with prayer and preaching. It is easier to perpetuate the board room mentality in church leadership than to live out in the fields with the sheep. Change is difficult, but our thinking must change. God's church needs shepherds, not corporate tycoons.

Just what did shepherds of the Bible do? They lived with their flocks (see the text mentioned above). Doing so enabled them to know their sheep, when they were sick, when they were missing and when they needed comforting. They defended their flocks. The teenaged David told King Saul that he had killed a lion and a bear in defense of his sheep. They led their flocks to the best water and pasture. Psalm 23 is a beautiful picture of that. Shepherds also laid down their lives for their flocks. Jesus illustrated this truth in John 10:11. And when the shepherd does this, the sheep will follow him anywhere with full trust.

God's shepherd today should learn from the ancient ones. He must

live with his flock. The flock is the local congregation. That means there must be regular contact so he can know the people, when they are hurting, sick, erring and missing. It is not always comfortable and pleasant. But it is necessary. He must defend the flock. This requires great familiarity with the Word

of God and potential heresies. He must be able to distinguish the difference between real heresy and the things which are simply nontraditional. Divisive influences must not be allowed to scatter the sheep. He must also lead the flock to the best water and pasture. This is referring to feeding God's sheep. A shepherd must be able to actively teach God's Word to others. He should be leading the charge in evangelism to grow the flock. And as long as there are many elders, there should never be a shortage of qualified adult teachers. And finally, he must daily lay down his life for the flock. I am talking about service. Shepherds are first servants. Serving shepherds will always be followed.

As this year draws to a close, pray for our shepherds to be empowered by Holy Spirit to faithfully and fervently be able to fulfill their responsibilities to the sheep of this congregation. Pray also that God will raise up more shepherds to lead the Del City church into both spiritual and numerical growth.
