

There were not nearly enough rest rooms to accommodate the crowd. People actually stood in 15-people lines in order to use the port-opotty. And you know how wonderful port-o-potties are! If you wanted a cold drink or something to eat, you had to weave your way through legs and feet and other body parts. Comfort was not a part of the evening.

But no one seemed to mind. Everyone was having a good time. And they were behaving quite well. I was impressed. What really amazed me, at least from the point of view as someone who addresses crowds, is that when James Taylor said he was through, the crowd called him back for three encores! This crowd was definitely committed to his concert.

I thought, "Wouldn't it be great to have this kind of commitment to Jesus Christ?" Think of it! Can you imagine a church where you stood in a hot line for two or three hours, paid \$50 per person to get in the door, mixed your sweat with everyone else's in the process, only to be jam-packed with 9,999 other people sitting on the ground for 4 more hours, with insufficient rest room facilities, bugs, no air conditioning, and where they called the preacher back to the pulpit for three more sermonettes after he had finished the first one? Would that take commitment or what?!!!

That may sound unusual, but it happened to Jesus many times. The Sermon on the Mount. Feeding the 5,000. Feeding the 4,000. Have we become so comfort conscious that we have forgotten commitment? Not according to the James Taylor crowd. Perhaps our human quality of commitment is just a bit misguided. What about yours?
