A Tribute to the Young Mother

As a preacher, I have the opportunity to see a lot that nobody else sees. I am able to observe what takes place during the assembly. Sleeping men, clock watchers, note passers, as well as people listening, nodding approval and disapproval of the lesson, those who take notes on sermons, etc. Yes, a lot is seen from the pulpit, and I just want to give some praise to a special lady.

Her name is YOUNG MOTHER. She has at least two children (one in diapers and the other barely out). Her husband helps in worship almost every Sunday and can rarely help her, or perhaps she is alone due to a mate who is out of duty or a non-member. She wrestles with the youngest, and has problems with the older one who has discovered pencils, cards, song books, and everything in mom's purse. She is always at a loss for what to do when the baby starts to cry. Taking him out may get him used to going out, leaving him in may disturb those around her. So she takes the stares, the screams of the child, and her conscience as long as she can, and then dashes out to dole out whatever form of punishment or comfort that is needed.

I believe that she is one of the best examples of Christianity. She exhibits so much of the *fruit of the Spirit* (Galatians 5:22-23). She loves her children enough to bring them, even though she hears very little of the sermon. She gains joy from knowing that she is obeying the Lord under hard circumstances. A special peace is hers because she is raising these babies in the nurture and admonition of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4). Without question, the young mother is patient due to her constant attendance. Her kindness is expressed when she does not snap back at sister so-and-so who makes sarcastic remarks about how much noise her children make. Goodness and faithfulness are perhaps best expressed by this aggressive young mother who seeks first the kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33), rather than neglect her own soul and that of her children. Her gentleness glows as she strives to figure out what will settle her children down during worship. Lastly is her *self-control*. She doesn't explode all over her children just because they are acting like children. She is not so concerned with her own dignity that she fails in the proper training of her children. She is in control of her life which is exhibited by her presence.

I love young mothers. As a preacher, I want them to know that I do not get angry with them when their children act up in worship. I do understand, and I would hope that everyone would. I believe that a child's soul is worth more than a completely quiet auditorium, and I believe that a mother who endures all this is worth *more than rubies* (Proverbs 31:10). May God bless you for bearing the fruit of the Spirit in this marvelous way.


