Effective Evangelism

What is really needed to effectively seek and save lost people? Everybody has an answer. Very few answers seem to actually work. Several years ago I came across a list of perceived needs for effective evangelism which the early church essentially debunked in how they fulfilled the Lord's command to go into all the world and make disciples. Consider this:

- Today we think we need a **good** preacher; the early church had preachers of **mediocre** background.
- Today we think we need a nice building in a nice location; the early church had no buildings at all.
- We think we need a good reputation in town; the early church was run out of town (Acts 4 and 17).
- We think we need successful men in leadership; the early church had humble fishermen, publicans and peasants.
- We think we need a nation at peace; the early church had the harsh rule of the Roman Caesars.
- We think we need **freedom** of religion; the early church was always being **opposed**.
- We think we need good weather; the early church was unconcerned with the weather (Paul worked even under the threat of shipwreck - Acts 27).
- We think we need the proper time of year for evangelism; the early church worked at it continually (Acts 20; 2 Timothy 4).
- We think we need good prospects; the early church had the Corinthians, a jailer and Saul of Tarsus.
- We think we need everything convenient; the early church had no buildings, air conditioning, song books, pew Bibles or baptisteries. But they had been with Jesus and that is what made the difference!

All the things we think we need today for effective evangelism are okay and would be nice under the most ideal circumstances. But life is seldom ideal. And death will surely come. And Judgment is imminent. As a result, millions of destinies are hanging in the balance waiting for us to get all our ducks in a row, to get everything we think we need.

Truthfully, it is time for us to quit stalling and making excuses, and just get on with the business of talking to our friends about Jesus Christ. If each one would bring one we would double in number this year.
