Small Group Discussion Guide

What's the Point

I. Opening Reflection | Read Ecclesiastes 8:10–14 and 9:1–3 aloud Icebreaker: (10 min)

1. Share a time when life felt unfair—when the "wicked" seemed to win and the "righteous" suffered.

II. Wisdom and Authority (20 Min)

- Ecclesiastes 8:10–14
- Psalm 73:1–14 "Why do the wicked prosper?"
- · Habakkuk 1:2-4 "How long, O Lord, will injustice prevail?"

Discussion Questions:.....

- 1. What examples of injustice in the world feel most troubling to you?
- 2. How do these passages validate our frustration with injustice?
- 3. How do you reconcile God's justice with the reality of injustice?

Application:

 How can we respond faithfully when justice is delayed or absent?

III. Joy as Resistance (20 min.)

- Ecclesiastes 8:15; 9:7–9
- · Philippians 4:4-7 "Rejoice in the Lord always..."
- John 16:33 "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart..."

Discussion Questions:

- What does it mean to "eat and drink with joy" in a broken world?
- 2. How is joy a form of spiritual defiance?
- 3. What practices help you cultivate joy even when life feels chaotic?

Application:

1. Share one way you can practice joy this week as an act of faith.

IV. Wisdom from Unlikely Place (20 Min)

- Fcclesiastes 9:13–18
- 2 Samuel 20:14–22 The unnamed wise woman who saves a city
- 1 Corinthians 1:26–31 "God chose the foolish things of the world..."

Discussion Questions:

- Have you ever received wisdom from someone the world might overlook?
- 2. Why do we often ignore quiet wisdom in favor of loud leadership?
- 3. How can we become better listeners to unexpected voices?
- 4. Application:
- 5. Who in your life might be offering quiet wisdom you've missed?

V. Closing Challenge & Prayer (10 Min)

- 1. What's one insight from Ecclesiastes that challenged your view of God or life?
- 2. What's one change you want to make in how you respond to injustice, joy, or wisdom?

Prayer Focus:

Ask God for discernment to see injustice clearly, courage to resist it with joy, and humility to receive wisdom from the unexpected places.

SERMON NOTES

What's The Point?

This week, we dive into Ecclesiastes 8–9 and wrestle with the hard questions: Why do the wicked prosper? Why does wisdom seem unrewarded? Is there justice under the sun? Rather than offering abstract thought experiments, Qoheleth confronts the real frustrations of life—and invites us to respond not with despair, but with joy. In a world of injustice, joy becomes resistance. In a world of forgetfulness, wisdom becomes defiance. Join us as we explore how delight and discernment can be acts of faith in a broken world.

Esta semana, nos sumergimos en Eclesiastés 8-9 y nos enfrentamos a preguntas difíciles: ¿Por qué prosperan los malvados? ¿Por qué parece que la sabiduría no tiene recompensa? ¿Existe la justicia bajo el sol? En lugar de ofrecer experimentos mentales abstractos, Qoheleth se enfrenta a las frustraciones reales de la vida y nos invita a responder no con desesperación, sino con alegría. En un mundo de injusticia, la alegría se convierte en resistencia. En un mundo de olvido, la sabiduría se convierte en rebeldía. Acompáñenos a explorar cómo el deleite y el discernimiento pueden ser actos de fe en un mundo quebrantado.
