EDITORIAL

B.L.T.

In America, when you see or hear "B.L.T." just about everybody knows that stands for a "Bacon, Lettuce and Tomato" sandwich. But for the purposes of this editorial, "B.L.T." stands for "Brotherly Love Talks." That seems to be the message in 1 John 3:14-18. "¹⁴ *If we love our brothers and sisters who are believers, it proves that we have passed from death to life. But a person who has no love is still dead.* ¹⁵ *Anyone who hates another brother or sister is really a murderer at heart. And you know that murderers don't have eternal life within them.* ¹⁶ We *know what real love is because Jesus gave up his life for us. So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters.* ¹⁷ *If someone has enough money to live well and sees a brother or sister in need but shows no compassion—how can God's love be in that person?* ¹⁸ *Dear children, let's not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions.*" John tells us in this text that our brotherly love talks about three virtues of the Christian heart.

Brotherly love talks about our Conversion (verses 14-15). The degree of your love for your brothers and sisters in Christ talks about whether you are truly converted to Christ or not. When you are truly converted, you will never face permanent death and you will always love your brothers and sisters. Love is the proof of life; hate is the proof of death. A Christ-centered heart is the only soil in which the genuine flower of love for others can grow. There is a beautiful country near the equator where tomatoes cannot grow. The problem is the soil. The weather is right, the seed is right, but the soil is wrong. Your heart is also like soil. And brotherly love cannot flourish in a heart-soil that has not been fully converted to Christ. A loveless heart is a reliable sign of a dead heart toward God. Brotherly love talks about our conversion.

Brotherly love talks about our Commitment (verse 16). John is talking about our commitment to the example of Christ. Christ was fully committed when He laid down His life for us. He calls us to imitate Him by doing the same. We are to be miniature Christs in this world. What Jesus did, we must do, or at least be willing to do. Love stays the course. Love never gives up. Love serves even when it hurts or is unpleasant. Love loans even when repayment isn't possible. Love forgives what some would think was unforgivable. Love perseveres in spite of the pain, disappointment or obstacles. Brotherly love is totally committed to the cause and to each other. Find the needs of others and go meet them. Don't wait for something good; make something good happen. Brotherly love is committed to being observant and opportunistic. Brotherly love talks about our commitment.

Brotherly love talks about our Compassion (verses 17-18). Sympathy is nice, but compassion is where real brotherly love shows up. It is one thing to tell someone you are sorry they have such a burden in life; it is altogether something different to put your shoulder under their burden and help them carry it. Christian compassion starts with **ability**: able to assist someone. Next is **awareness**: we must be realistically aware of those around us. Then it is **action** that seals the deal: do something for another. Maybe you'll do the wrong thing or get hurt or get too involved. That's not the point. Here's the point: DO SOMETHING! Brotherly love talks about our compassion.

Eyewitness Good News: Fuel for Disciple-Living 1 John 4:16-21

What is it that makes disciple-living possible? What cranks you up to be an active disciple of Jesus Christ every day? I like to think of it as fuel. We are very fuel conscious in America. It is what keeps us mobile. Bad fuel means bad performance in your vehicle. Hesitation when you accelerate will get you killed. Disciple-living is not that different from driving a vehicle. You need plenty of good fuel to have an equally good response. Our text today tells us plainly that the fuel for disciple-living is **God's love**. Satan often offers alternative fuel. John gives us three compelling reasons why we should always choose God's fuel.


