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EDITORIAL

Time to Be Mature

I am sure by now that most of you have heard about our misadventures at Dollywood in Pigeon Forge, TN. That is one of the places we stopped on our recent 25th Wedding Anniversary trip. It was all fun and games for a while. The first misadventure was Susie's iPhone went missing after one of the rides we were on. "Not to worry," I said, "because we can use the Find My Phone app from my iPhone." Well, that only gives you an approximate location within 50 yards. It took some searching, but we finally found it. Whew!

Do you know where to start? If we are going to grow a great church for Jesus at Del City, we need all hands on deck to spread the Good News of Jesus. It is time to be mature. Are you ready?
