EDITORIAL

Does God's Heart Cry?

I was asked this week to do a memorial service for a family that didn't have a preacher. I accepted, but the family found someone else to do the task. But it made me think about the many funeral services I have been a part of, both as a family member and as a preacher.

One thing they have all had in common is the sadness connected with the loss of a loved one. As I thought about that sadness further, I pondered the question that I think every Bible-believing, Christ follower should ask: Do you think God ever cries for those who remain spiritually dead? When we consider that Christ bore the burden of sin for every single person who has ever lived (1 John 2:2), what must God feel about those who remain eternally lost forever because they voluntarily chose not to believe? What must God feel about us if some would accept the Gospel if only someone shared it with them, and we voluntarily decide not to tell them?

As the Outreach Minister at Del City, I have had to challenge my view of lost people. And I must admit, I haven't always felt the same way about them as God does. Have you? Or do you share in this struggle?

Here's what the Bible says about God's compassion for the lost:

- God Weeps for the Lost. Have you ever wept for the lost? I shamefully admit I don't always. But right after Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the Bible says when He saw the city, He cried over it because of their
 - lostness (Luke 19:41-44). How can you and I ever be people after God's own heart if we don't have the same compassion that God has for those still lost in their sins?
- 2. God Seeks After the Lost. This means to go intentionally after those who are lost. Jesus wasn't as concerned over those who were already under His guidance, but there was an urgency to rescue the lost (Luke 19:10: John 10:16). If we are to be like Christ, we too must seek earnestly for those who need to

be saved, just as Jesus did.

What must God feel about those who remain eternally lost forever because they voluntarily chose not to believe?

3. God Died for the Lost. Every person of Christ was once in a lost state. The Bible says we were enemies of God. And it was while we were in this place that God died for us (Romans 5:8). What if we were still lost in our sins? Would we not want those in Christ to teach us the Gospel? What makes many in the church so reluctant?

We are told to emulate the example and likeness of Christ, and to accomplish this fully; we must see people the way God does. And we must do all we can in the power of God Almighty to seek and rescue the lost because that's what Christ did and what He taught His disciples to do. Will you join in the effort with me to accomplish this together?

There are many stories in the Bible that can have a huge impact on us. Stories about people of great courage. Stories of those who had faith in the face of overwhelming obstacles. And stories about those who always chose love. However, some stories in the Bible tend to make us scratch our heads, wondering "why is this in here?" For me, one of those stories is the tale of **Achan**. But, when you ask good questions about this seemingly unsettling story, it turns into a beautiful message.
