After the Dream Comes Mourning

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted" (Matthew 5:4).

What do you do with a broken dream? How do you deal with a broken heart? All of us have felt the pain as we walked along the street of broken dreams which was strewn with broken hearts. Joy, hope, and expectation are often followed by discouragement, then despair.

After the dream comes *mourning*. We mourn our disappointments. We mourn our failures. We mourn our guilt. We had hoped the marriage would work out. We had hoped he would finish school. We had hoped the x-rays and biopsy would be negative. We had hoped that he would stop drinking. We had hoped that job would be available. We had hoped that she would turn her life around. We had hoped that we could find love and acceptance in the church. We had hoped that the newly elected government would find solutions to our economic and social problems. What do you do with a broken dream?

Often, we keep asking and the answer does not come. We are left wallowing in disappointment, self-pity and despair. We need to understand that for God's people it does not end there—the promise of comfort is sure. It would be hard to imagine a more broken-hearted people than the disciples when Jesus was killed on the cross. This did not match their dreams and expectations. They had visions of some kind of massive miracle which would rid their homeland of the Roman oppressors and restore David's throne. The dream was crushed by the blows of the hammer against the spikes driven into His flesh. It was destroyed by the "thud" of the cross as it dropped into the hole with the weight of His mangled body.

Disappointment! Devastation! Discouragement! Broken dreams! Broken hearts! We now realize that it was in their broken dreams that God was preparing them for the greatest experience of their lives—the resurrection! Their mourning experience made them ready for the comforting experience. Why death? Why pain and suffering? Why unfulfilled physical need? Why disappointment? Why broken dreams? "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."

Our God, the sustainer of all life, is always working to transform defeat into victory, death into life, and mourning into comfort for His people. This is true on every level of our lives—our relationships, our hopes, and expectations and our confrontation with suffering and death. All of it is being worked together for our good (Romans 8:28).

The death, burial and resurrection of Jesus is the most powerful, life-transforming word God has ever spoken to us. Because He rose again, we need never doubt that after the dream comes the mourning—then comfort.
