EDITORIAL

The Role of Jesus in Our Lives

Of the four Gospels, Mark's is the shortest and precise in it's intention. Mark doesn't linger over a lot of details, but desires his readers to hone in to see the real Jesus. It is as if Mark feels an urgency to very real about who Jesus is and why we need Him as our means of salvation.

The very first chapter of Mark tells of four miracles Jesus performed in His early ministry: casting out an unclean spirit in the synagogue, the healing of Peter's Mother-in-Law, numerous sick people in the city, and a leper. I think it might be all too common for many of to quickly read these accounts and never take the time to understand what is Mark's point (or any of the Gospels who speak of the miracles Jesus did). To fail to understand this may cause us never to really personalize what Jesus really means to us. But I see three very important things we must understand regarding the role Jesus is to have in our lives.

1) Perspective-Miracles performed in the First Century had one real purpose-to confirm the Word of God (Mark 16:20). Jesus didn't heal the sick and cure the lame simply because He was a good humanitarian, rather it was to confirm His identity as Emmanuel, meaning God with us. The fact that Jesus could heal the sick, cast out demons, walk on

water, feed 5000 people with a few loaves of bread and a couple of fish, is indeed impressive. But Jesus didn't do these things to impress, but to prove that He was the Son of God (Luke 7:20-22; John 10:24-25; 37-38). But what does any of this have to do with us?

2) Pertinence-Unless we believe in the miracles of Jesus, we cannot be convinced that Jesus has the ability to help us in our times of need. What would be the sense to believe in a Higher Power who doesn't have

any more power than we have ourselves? But if I am convinced that the miracles happened, suddenly I become aware of my need of Him, for He can do far more than I can in my own ability.

- **3) Prayer-**This is the means to make miracles possible today. Many claim to have the same miraculous ability that Jesus or the Apostles did, even though Paul says that these abilities were always meant to be temporary (1 Cor. 13:8). But our prayers have power when we entrust our cares and concerns upon the One who has the power to do something about them on our behalf. It would be wise to remember some things about prayer:
- A) Nothing happens if we don't have a prayer life (James 4:2).
- B) God reserves the right to say "no" (James 4:3).
- C) Our manner of life can hinder our prayers. Lifting holy hands (1 Timothy 2:8) means we are at peace with one another and our lives are not dredged in sin. Luke 18:27-Jesus says, "The things which are impossible with men are Possible with God."


