Who Are We?

There is an old Twilight Zone episode where five characters (an Army Major, Clown, Tramp, Ballerina and Bagpiper) are all trapped in a receptacle trying to figure how to get out. At one point, one of the exasperated characters shouts out, "Who are We?". The episode ends with these five characters being toys in a Salvation Army Christmas time bin.

That question of "Who are We" is a valid one among those of us who profess to be Christians. We are asked that by unbelievers trying to understand what's behind our motivations. There are brothers and sisters who ask that about each other. And there might even be occasion to ask the question in connection with how God sees us. The fact is that there ought to be qualities about each of us that identify with the example of Jesus Christ. None of us do this perfectly. But it is also easy to become complacent in establishing our identity as Christian people, a people motivated by our love for Jesus and other people. The Bible defines the essence of who or what we ought to be.

Christians are to be People of Compassion. God's compassion for lost people is expressed throughout the pages of Scripture, but two passages seem to really stand out: Hosea 11:1-8 and Matthew 9:36.

Compassion means to feel the hurt of someone else. Christlike compassion is expressed in responding to the hurting and reaching out to the helpless.

Christians are to be Relational. God had Moses build a Tabernacle because He desired to be among the Children of Israel. Jesus built relations first with His disciples and then with the outcasts. *Relational Christianity* is where we build partnerships with each other to fulfill the Gospel Mission. We partner with each other for training for and execution of the mission plan.

Christians are to be Reciprocal. The church was defined by its mutual respect, sharing and loving of each other. Jesus expressed this idea in each of His "One Another" Passages. We are to be kind and compassionate to one another (Ephesians 4:32); we are to be loving and affectionate with one another (Romans 12:10); we are to be empathetic toward one another (Romans 12:15-16), and we are to be forgiving to one another (Colossians 3:13).

All of these qualities build genuine Christians. They should define every part of who we are. "Who are We?" We are people whose love is genuine; who love being in relation with each other, and who are compassionate with each other. And we are to show these sides when we speak with unbelievers. Because that is what Jesus did.

The Bible defines the essence of who or what we ought to be as Christ followers, as doing the same things that Jesus did.

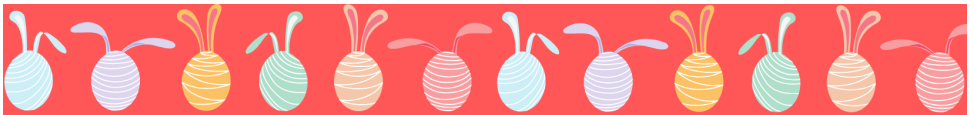
