EDITORIAL

FAMILY DEVOTIONAL

In the coming weeks, people around the world, whether Christian or not, will be taking part in a holiday that at its core, celebrates the birth of our savior Jesus.

While we as Christians should be celebrating this far more often than once a year, the way people celebrate this particular holiday this time of year has always confused me. For instance, what is it about the birth of our Savior that causes people to drag trees into their homes and decorate it? Why do we go through the frustrating and exhausting efforts of putting lights on the roof? And why are we excited about the prospect of a large man dressed in red committing felony breaking and entering into every home on the planet?

Being a history buff, I did some digging. It turns out many of these oddities are left over from when pagan cultures would celebrate the winter solstice. Interestingly, the early Christians saw the culture around them, celebrating a season, and then tied it to the birth of the Son of God.

This was not a new strategy for Christians. In fact, Paul, when in Athens, does the same thing. (Read Acts 17: 16-34) In that passage Paul uses the culture around him to point toward Jesus. Brilliantly, he does this without watering down his message, and some were even converted!

Do we use this strategy today to try and reach people? While the culture around us can often seem in opposition to our message, there are always chances to use it to point to Christ.

- 2. What are some aspects of our culture that could be used to talk about God?
- 3. Who are some people in your life that may be open to having a conversation about faith?
- 4. What are some things we can be praying for this week as a family?
