EDITORIAL

Be Fruitful and Multiply

In the very first chapter of Genesis, God gives a command to the very first male and female, Adam and Eve, to "be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it." (Genesis 1:28)

We read and understand this text to mean to have children and populate the earth. But I wonder if there isn't a broader meaning than just procreation.

In any typical family dynamic there are at least three intentions that are considered by any married couple: 1) To Have Children; 2) To Want Children, but for some reason, can't; and 3) To not Desire Children at all.

The command to be fruitful and multiply is preceded in the text with the fact that God had blessed them. In the same manner, God has blessed those who are in Christ, and has commanded us to be fruitful and multiply. Ephesians 1:3 says that God has blessed those in Christ with "every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ." And with these blessings we are then to "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Just as Adam and Eve were blessed by God and commanded to be fruitful and multiply, so those in Christ are to do the same. All Christians however fall somewhere under the same three intentions as the married couple:

Attempting. There are some who desire to bring people to Jesus, but haven't had much success. But at least they are trying. Jesus in His parable of the seeds indicated that there would

be attempts to be fruitful and multiply which will not produce. But there is good in making the attempt (Matthew 13:1-9; 18-23).

Abstaining. Unfortunately the vast majority of those who see themselves as Christians aren't making any attempt to reach others with the gospel at all. It is reasoned that they aren't qualified or as experienced as others, therefore no real effort is given. The largely ignored warning Jesus gave about unfruitful laborers ought to be heard and put into practice, lest we face the consequences of being cut off for ineffective service. (Luke 13:6-9; 19:11-27; John 15:1-8). The cost of not doing anything to bring others to Christ is much too high. We must be busy with the work that has been entrusted to the Lord's church

Abounding. The John text tells us that those who abide in Christ WILL bear fruit. God's Word cannot return empty (Isaiah 55:11). It is ingrained in who we are in Christ. Be Fruitful and Multiply for it is the most rewarding work we could ever be apart of.

Our lives are often filled with challenges which make us feel spiritually run down. As problems persist, we may even find our spiritual lives running on fumes, emotionally and physically exhausted.
