## 1. God knows EVERYTHING. (Vs 1)

LORD, you have searched me and known me.

"Therefore, don't be afraid of them, since there is nothing covered that won't be uncovered and nothing hidden that won't be made known. <sup>27</sup>What I tell you in the dark, speak in the light. What you hear in a whisper, proclaim on the housetops. <sup>28</sup>Don't fear those who kill the body but are not able to kill the soul; rather, fear him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. <sup>29</sup>Aren't two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's consent. <sup>30</sup>But even the hairs of your head have all been counted. <sup>31</sup>So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

## 2. He knows WHAT we do. (Vs 2-3)

You know when I sit down and when I stand up; you understand my thoughts from far away. <sup>3</sup>You observe my travels and my rest; you are aware of all my ways.

Psalm 139:2-3 (CSB)

What should we say then? Should we continue in sin so that grace may multiply? <sup>2</sup>Absolutely not! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup>Or are you unaware that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup>Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life. <sup>5</sup>For if we have been united with him in the likeness of his death, we will certainly also be in the likeness of his resurrection. <sup>6</sup>For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be rendered powerless so that we may no longer be

enslaved to sin, <sup>7</sup>since a person who has died is freed from sin. <sup>8</sup>Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him...

## 3. He knows WHY we do what we do. (Vs. 4-6)

Before a word is on my tongue, you know all about it, LORD. <sup>5</sup>You have encircled me; you have placed your hand on me. <sup>6</sup>This wondrous knowledge is beyond me. It is lofty; I am unable to reach it.

Psalm 139:4-6 (CSB)

A song of ascents. Of David. LORD, my heart is not proud; my eyes are not haughty. I do not get involved with things too great or too wondrous for me. <sup>2</sup>Instead, I have calmed and quieted my soul like a weaned child with its mother; my soul is like a weaned child. <sup>3</sup>Israel, put your hope in the LORD, both now and forever.

Psalm 131:1-3 (CSB)

Little children, let us not love in word or speech, but in action and in truth. <sup>19</sup>This is how we will know that we belong to the truth and will reassure our hearts before him <sup>20</sup>whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows all things. <sup>21</sup>Dear friends, if our hearts don't condemn us, we have confidence before God <sup>22</sup>and receive whatever we ask from him because we keep his commands and do what is pleasing in his sight. <sup>23</sup>Now this is his command: that we believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another as he commanded us. <sup>24</sup>The one who keeps his commands remains in him, and he in him. And the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he has given us.

1 John 3:18-24 (CSB)
