## A COMMUNITY UNITED IN PRAYER Acts 1:12-26 (CSB)

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, which is near Jerusalem—a Sabbath day's journey away. <sup>13</sup>When they arrived, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying: Peter, John, James, Andrew, Philip, Thomas, Bartholomew, Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas the son of James. <sup>14</sup>They all were continually united in prayer, along with the women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers. 15 In those days Peter stood up among the brothers and sisters—the number of people who were together was about a hundred twenty—and said, 16"Brothers and sisters, it was necessary that the Scripture be fulfilled that the Holy Spirit through the mouth of David foretold about Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. <sup>17</sup>For he was one of our number and shared in this ministry." <sup>18</sup>Now this man acquired a field with his unrighteous wages. He fell headfirst, his body burst open and his intestines spilled out. <sup>19</sup>This became known to all the residents of Jerusalem, so that in their own language that field is called Hakeldama (that is, Field of Blood). <sup>20</sup>"For it is written in the Book of Psalms: Let his dwelling become desolate; let no one live in it; and Let someone else take his position. <sup>21</sup>"Therefore, from among the men who have accompanied us during the whole time the Lord Jesus went in and out among us—<sup>22</sup>beginning from the baptism of John until the day he was taken up from us—from among these, it is necessary that one become a witness with us of his resurrection." <sup>23</sup>So they proposed two: Joseph, called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. <sup>24</sup>Then they prayed, "You, Lord, know everyone's hearts; show which of these two you have chosen <sup>25</sup>to take the place in this apostolic ministry that Judas left to go where he belongs." <sup>26</sup>Then they cast lots for them, and the lot fell to Matthias and he was added to the eleven apostles.

## 1. Prayer should be our <u>CORPORATE PRIORITY</u>.

And it will be in the last days, says God, that I will pour out my Spirit on all people; then your sons and your daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, and your old men will dream dreams. <sup>18</sup>I will even pour out my Spirit on my servants in those days, both men and women and they will prophesy. <sup>19</sup>I will display wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below: blood and fire and a cloud of smoke. <sup>20</sup>The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the great and glorious day of the Lord comes. <sup>21</sup>Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. ## 2. Prayer should be our PERSONAL HABIT.

## 3. Prayer should be our **ESSENTIAL STRATEGY**.

First of all, then, I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone...

1 Timothy 2:1 (CSB)

Therefore, with your minds ready for action, be sober-minded and set your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. 14As obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires of your former ignorance. <sup>15</sup>But as the one who called you is holy, you also are to be holy in all your conduct; 16 for it is written, Be holy, because I am holy. <sup>17</sup>If you appeal to the Father who judges impartially according to each one's work, you are to conduct yourselves in reverence during your time living as strangers. <sup>18</sup>For you know that you were redeemed from your empty way of life inherited from your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of an unblemished and spotless lamb. <sup>20</sup>He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was revealed in these last times for you. <sup>21</sup>Through him you believe in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. <sup>22</sup>Since you have purified yourselves by your obedience to the truth, so that you show sincere brotherly love for each other, from a pure heart love one another constantly, <sup>23</sup>because you have been born again not of perishable seed but of imperishable—through the living and enduring word of God. <sup>24</sup>For All flesh is like grass, and all its glory like a flower of the grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, <sup>25</sup>but the word of the Lord endures forever. And this word is the gospel that was proclaimed to you.
