GET BEYOND YOUR WALLS Luke 10:1-12 CSB (Seat Bible: Page 921)

After this, the Lord appointed seventy-two others, and he sent them ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself was about to go. ²He told them, "The harvest is abundant, but the workers are few. Summoning the Twelve, he gave them power and authority over all the demons and to heal diseases. ²Then he sent them to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. ³"Take nothing for the road," he told them, "no staff, no traveling bag, no bread, no money; and don't take an extra shirt. ⁴Whatever house you enter, stay there and leave from there. ⁵If they do not welcome you, when you leave that town, shake off the dust from your feet as a testimony against them." ⁶So they went out and traveled from village to village, proclaiming the good news and healing everywhere.

Go... even though the road is <u>DANGEROUS</u>. (v 3)
"Now go; I'm sending you out like lambs among wolves."

3. Go... <u>RESTING</u> in His <u>PROVISION</u>. (v 4-8)

"Don't carry a money-bag, traveling bag, or sandals; don't greet anyone along the road. ⁵Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' ⁶If a person of peace is there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷Remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they offer, for the worker is worthy of his wages. 4. Go... TRUSTING in His POWER. (v 9-12)

"'Heal the sick who are there, and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near you.'" Luke 10:9 (CSB)

On the contrary, what does it say? The message is near you, in your mouth and in your heart. This is the message of faith that we proclaim: ⁹If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. ¹¹For the Scripture says, Everyone who believes on him will not be put to shame, ¹²since there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord of all richly blesses all who call on him. ¹³For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Romans 10:8-13 (CSB)

LORD, you are my portion and my cup of blessing; you hold my future. ⁶The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; indeed, I have a beautiful inheritance. ⁷I will bless the LORD who counsels me—even at night when my thoughts trouble me. ⁸I always let the LORD guide me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. ⁹Therefore my heart is glad and my whole being rejoices; my body also rests securely. ¹⁰For you will not abandon me to Sheol; you will not allow your faithful one to see decay. ¹¹You reveal the path of life to me; in your presence is abundant joy; at your right hand are eternal pleasures.
