## QUESTION #1: WHAT'S OWNERSHIP?

• Ownership = the act or state of possessing something. It's the legal right to use it, possess it, and give it away.

## QUESTION #2: WHO OWNS IT?

God owns <u>EVERYTHING</u>, and we <u>STEWARD</u> His blessing.

The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein.

Psalm 24:1 (ESV)

## QUESTION #3: WHAT DO I DO WITH IT?

- REALIZE my stewardship in relation to God's ownership.
- <u>RESPECT</u> the Owner (and steward) of the property.
- <u>REFUSE</u> to take what you weren't made to steward and be <u>RESPONSIBLE</u> for what you have.

#### QUESTION #3: WHAT ARE WAYS PEOPLE STEAL IT?

# General Theft:

Theft, robbery, extortion. (Ezekiel 22:29)

Kidnapping or slavery. (Exodus 21:16)

Stealing from employers. (Titus 2:9-10 – slaves)

Employers stealing from employees. (Jeremiah 22:13)

Refusing to work for a living. (2 Thessalonians 3:10-12)

Rip-offs and false measures. (Proverbs 11:1)

Failure to pay debts. (Psalm 37:21)

Tax evasion. (Mark 12:17; Romans 13:7)

Fraud. (Leviticus 19:13)

Refusing to give credit/praise for a job well done. (Proverbs 3:27)

Charging excessive interest. (Proverbs 28:8)

Gossip and rumor. (Proverbs 22:1)

\*Not an exhaustive list, specifics drawn from scripture.

## Stealing from God:

Failing to give back to God. (Malachi 3:8-10)

Living a hypocritical life. (Jeremiah 7:9-10 or Romans 2:21)

## QUESTION #4: WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE STEAL IT?

Consequences of Stealing:

Anger of God and His wrath. (Joshua 7:1 – Achan stole devoted things.) Deprives others what they are due. (Leviticus 19:13)

Brings shame/disgrace to the thief. (Jeremiah 2:26)

Leads to deception, lies, and even greater sin. (John 12:4-6)

## QUESTION #5: WHY DO WE STEAL?

Ultimately, theft comes from a lack of <u>CONTENTMENT</u>.

#### **GUARDRAILS AGAINST THEFT**

• Guardrail #1: LOVE

Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. <sup>9</sup> For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." <sup>10</sup> Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

Romans 13:8-10 (ESV)

- Love robs the thief of his FOCUS.
- Guardrail #2: GRATITUDE

Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."

Hebrews 13:5 (ESV)

Gratitude robs the thief of his ATTITUDE.
