## ORDINARY TO DO THE EXTRAORDINARY Acts 11:19-30 (NLT)

## The Truth of Today:

• God uses <u>ORDINARY PEOPLE</u> to do the <u>EXTRAORDINARY</u>.

Meanwhile, the believers who had been scattered during the persecution after Stephen's death traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch of Syria. They preached the word of God, but only to Jews. <sup>20</sup>However, some of the believers who went to Antioch from Cyprus and Cyrene began preaching to the Gentiles about the Lord Jesus.<sup>21</sup>The power of the Lord was with them, and a large number of these Gentiles believed and turned to the Lord. <sup>22</sup>When the church at Jerusalem heard what had happened, they sent Barnabas to Antioch.<sup>23</sup>When he arrived and saw this evidence of God's blessing, he was filled with joy, and he encouraged the believers to stay true to the Lord. <sup>24</sup>Barnabas was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and strong in faith. And many people were brought to the Lord. <sup>25</sup>Then Barnabas went on to Tarsus to look for Saul. <sup>26</sup>When he found him, he brought him back to Antioch. Both of them stayed there with the church for a full year, teaching large crowds of people. (It was at Antioch that the believers were first called Christians.)<sup>27</sup>During this time some prophets traveled from Jerusalem to Antioch.<sup>28</sup>One of them named Agabus stood up in one of the meetings and predicted by the Spirit that a great famine was coming upon the entire Roman world. (This was fulfilled during the reign of Claudius.)<sup>29</sup>So the believers in Antioch decided to send relief to the brothers and sisters in Judea, everyone giving as much as they could. <sup>30</sup>This they did, entrusting their gifts to Barnabas and Saul to take to the elders of the church in Jerusalem.

2. The ordinary must <u>GROW</u> in God's extraordinary <u>GRACE</u>. When the church at Jerusalem heard what had happened, they sent Barnabas to Antioch.

"Thus you will recognize them by their fruits."

Matthew 7:20 (NLT)

When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, <sup>20</sup>idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, <sup>21</sup>envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God. <sup>22</sup>But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup>gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things! Galatians 5:19-23 (NLT)

Show mercy to those whose faith is wavering.

3. Ordinary people will <u>GIVE</u> what <u>GOD</u> has given.
