HELP FOR THE HURTING: WHAT GROWS OUR FELLOWSHIP? Acts 3:1-10 (CSB)

Now Peter and John were going up to the temple for the time of prayer at three in the afternoon. ² A man who was lame from birth was being carried there. He was placed each day at the temple gate called Beautiful, so that he could beg from those entering the temple. ³ When he saw Peter and John about to enter the temple, he asked for money. ⁴ Peter, along with John, looked straight at him and said, "Look at us." ⁵ So he turned to them, expecting to get something from them. ⁶ But Peter said, "I don't have silver or gold, but what I do have, I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!" ⁷ Then, taking him by the right hand he raised him up, and at once his feet and ankles became strong. ⁸ So he jumped up and started to walk, and he entered the temple with them—walking, leaping, and praising God. ⁹ All the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰ and they recognized that he was the one who used to sit and beg at the Beautiful Gate of the temple. So they were filled with awe and astonishment at what had happened to him.

Acts 3:1-10 (CSB)

1. We grow our fellowship by offering the lost and hurting an ACCURATE DIAGNOSIS.

Peter, along with John, looked straight at him and said, "Look at us."

Acts 3:4 (CSB)

2. We grow our fellowship by offering the lost and hurting an EFFECTIVE TREATMENT.

So he turned to them, expecting to get something from them. ⁶ But Peter said, "I don't have silver or gold, but what I do have, I give you: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, get up and walk!" ⁷ Then, taking him by the right hand he raised him up, and at once his feet and ankles became strong.

Acts 3:5-7 (CSB)

So he jumped up and started to walk, and he entered the temple with them—walking, leaping, and praising God. ⁹ All the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰ and they recognized that he was the one who used to sit and beg at the Beautiful Gate of the temple. So they were filled with awe and astonishment at what had happened to him.

Acts 3:8-10 (CSB)

3. We grow our fellowship by offering routinely religious people <u>TRUTH</u>, <u>HOPE</u>, and <u>MISSION</u>.

While he was holding on to Peter and John, all the people, utterly astonished, ran toward them in what is called Solomon's Colonnade.¹² When Peter saw this, he addressed the people: "Fellow Israelites, why are you amazed at this? Why do you stare at us, as though we had made him walk by our own power or godliness?¹³ The God of

Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied before Pilate, though he had decided to release him.¹⁴ You denied the Holv and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer released to you.¹⁵ You killed the source of life, whom God raised from the dead; we are witnesses of this. ¹⁶ By faith in his name, his name has made this man strong, whom you see and know. So the faith that comes through Jesus has given him this perfect health in front of all of you. ¹⁷ "And now, brothers and sisters, I know that you acted in ignorance, just as your leaders also did.¹⁸ In this way God fulfilled what he had predicted through all the prophets—that his Messiah would suffer.¹⁹ Therefore repent and turn back, so that your sins may be wiped out, ²⁰ that seasons of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send Jesus, who has been appointed for you as the Messiah.²¹ Heaven must receive him until the time of the restoration of all things, which God spoke about through his holy prophets from the beginning.²² Moses said: The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your brothers. You must listen to everything he tells you.²³ And everyone who does not listen to that prophet will be completely cut off from the people.²⁴ "In addition, all the prophets who have spoken, from Samuel and those after him, have also foretold these days. ²⁵ You are the sons of the prophets and of the covenant that God made with your ancestors, saying to Abraham, And all the families of the earth will be blessed through your offspring.²⁶ God raised up his servant and sent him first to you to bless you by turning each of you from your evil ways."

Acts 3:11-26 (CSB)

Dear friends, don't be surprised when the fiery ordeal comes among you to test you, as if something unusual were happening to you. ¹³ Instead, rejoice as you share in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may also rejoice with great joy when his glory is revealed. ¹⁴ If you are ridiculed for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. ¹⁵ Let none of you suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or a meddler. ¹⁶ But if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed but let him glorify God in having that name. ¹⁷ For the time has come for judgment to begin with God's household, and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who disobey the gospel of God? ¹⁸ And if a righteous person is saved with difficulty, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner? ¹⁹ So then, let those who suffer according to God's will entrust themselves to a faithful Creator while doing what is good.
