





CRITERIA FOR THE KING

Deuteronomy 17:14–20 provides a specific set of criteria for the king to live by. God gives three specific things that kings of Israel must not do:

- 1 The king must not acquire a great number of horses, probably chariot horses, especially chariot horses from Egypt.
- 2 The king must not accumulate large amounts of silver and gold.
- 3 The king must not "take many wives." (17.17)
- 4 Implied avoid any serious relationship with Egypt, the land which God delivered them from. (17.16)
- 1. 12,00 chariot horses 1 Kings 10.26 and 1 Kings 4.26 (many of which are from Egypt). 1 Kings 10.28
- 2. Twice the narrator states the large number (12,000) of chariot horses Solomon accumulates (1 Kgs. 4:26; 10:26). Many of these horses from Egypt (1 Kings 10.28).
- 3. Abundance of silver and gold 1 Kings 9.28; 10.14
- 4. "many wives" 700 wives, 300 concubines 1 Kings 11.1-3
- 5. Marriage to Pharaoh's daughter 1Kings 3.1, 7.8, 11.1

While the story appears on the surface to be praising Solomon, the text is subtly criticizing him for his failure to be faithful to the terms God gave Israel. In 1 Kings 11.1-13 Solomon has turned away from the God of Abraham to worship many other gods, even building worship sites for these detestable pagan gods.
