

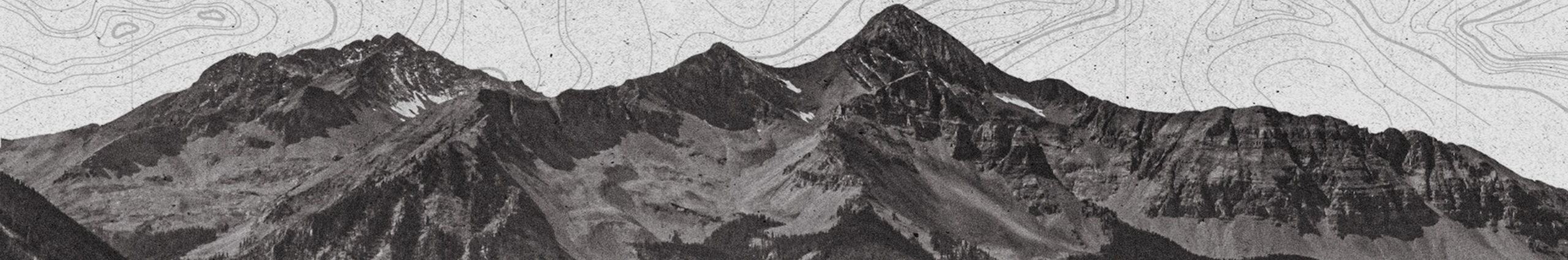

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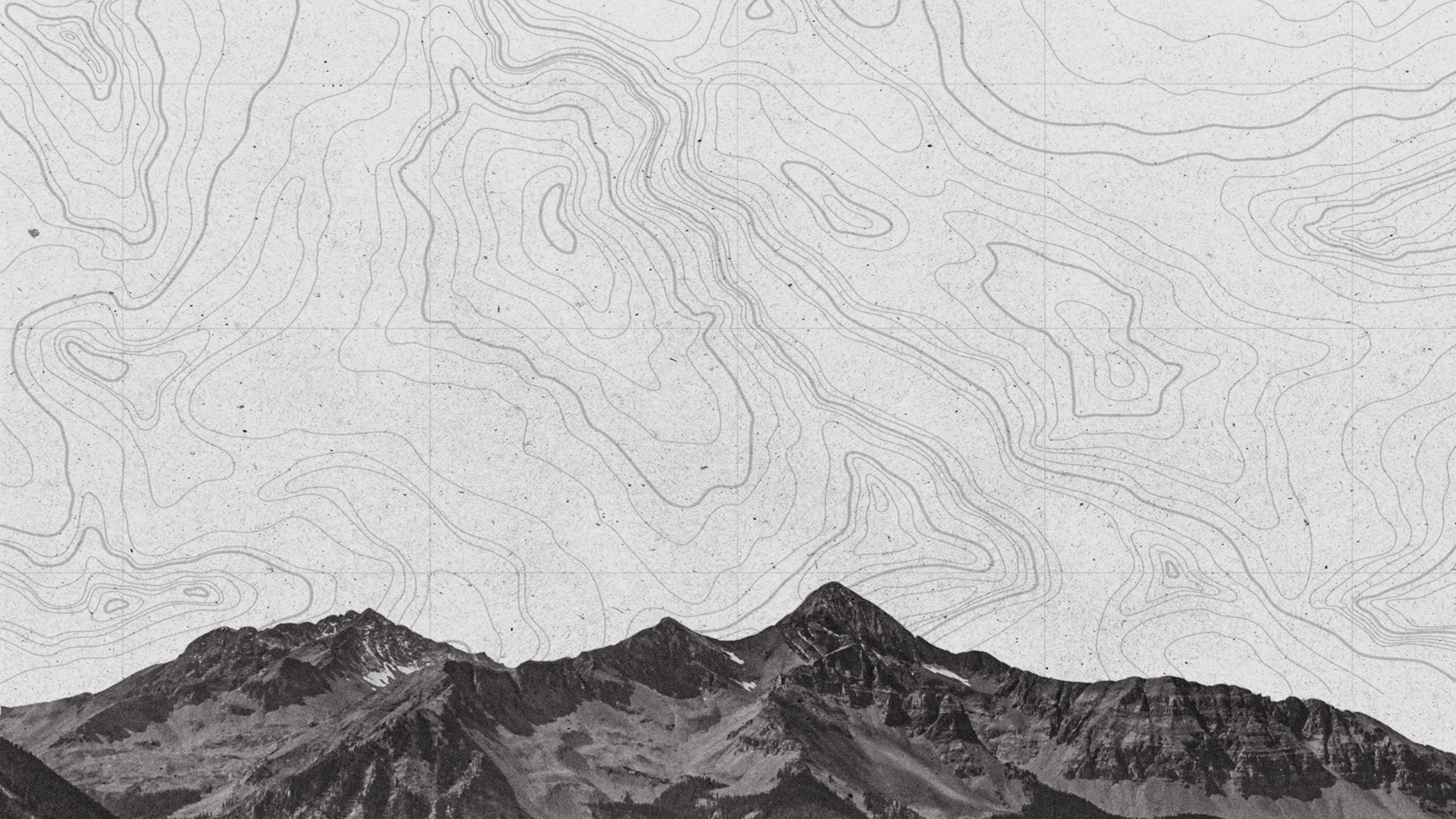

Engage someone in a gospel conversation. Invite them to Treat Street Weekend. Here's some questions you could ask them:

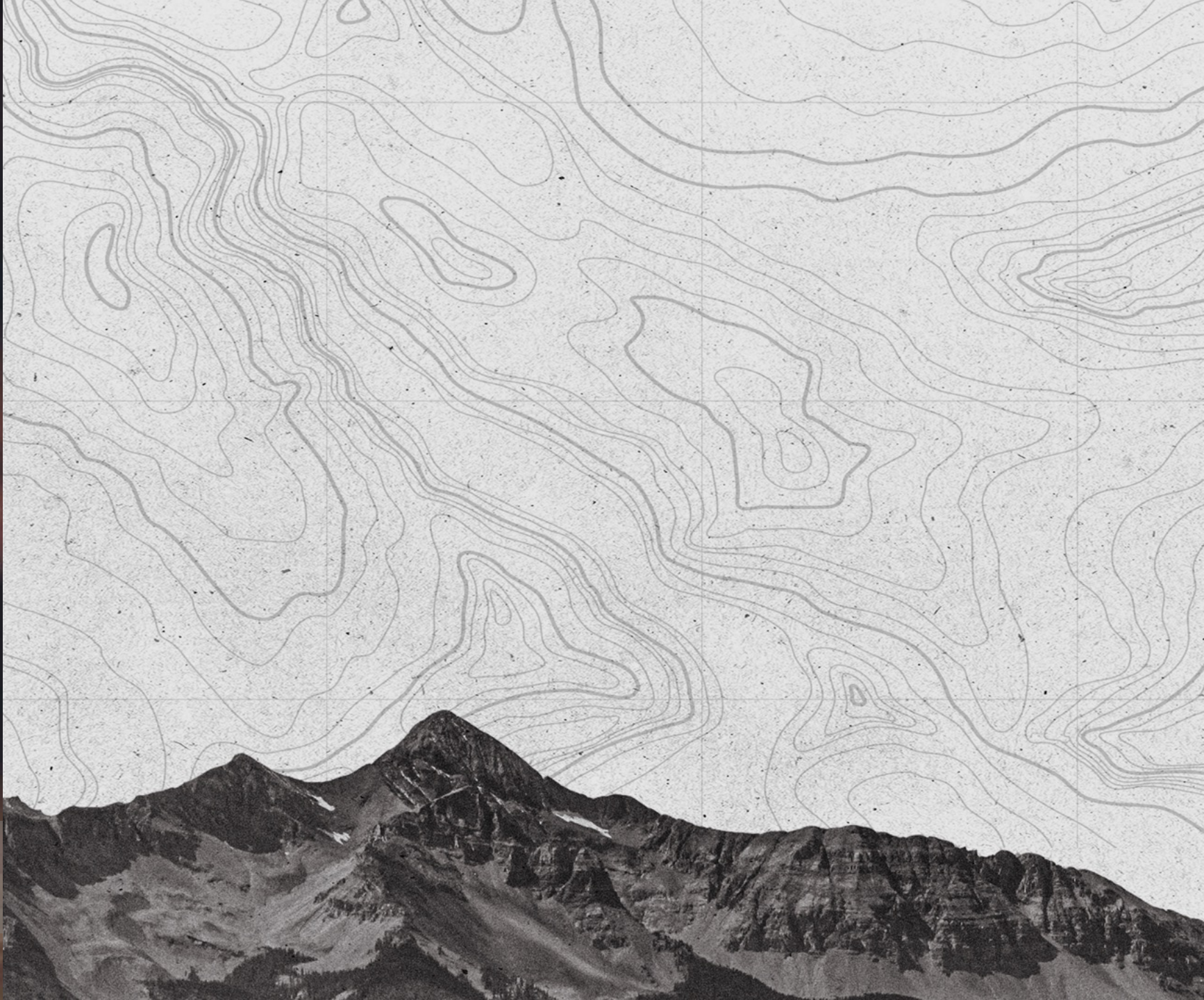
