

Two Foundational Questions

1) WHAT is divine meditation?

What divine meditation is NOT

Eastern meditation: an attempt to empty the mind.

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Eastern meditation: an attempt to **empty the mind**. Christian meditation: an attempt to **fill the mind**.

"Christian meditation, very simply, is the ability to hear God's voice and obey his word... What happens in meditation is that we create the emotional and spiritual space which allows Christ to construct an inner sanctuary in the heart." – Richard Foster, *Celebration of Discipline*

-hāgâ Hebrew words for meditation: used 58 times in Old Testament

Various meanings: listening to God's word, reflecting on God's works, rehearsing God's deeds, ruminating on God's law, and more.

And **Isaac went out to meditate** in the field in the evening. - Genesis 24:63

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When I remember you upon my bed, and **meditate on you in the watches of the night**... – Psalm 63:6


When I remember God, I moan;
