DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What do you seek and pursue the most for the sake of your “happiness?” How does this reveal your level of trust in the Lord?
2. Read Matthew 7:7-12. What does Jesus mean by, “seek and you will find?” If you read these verses out of context, would you assume you can get whatever you want from God? Please explain.
3. Read Habakkuk 1:1-4. What did Habakkuk complain to God about? What have you “complained” to God the most about? What does what we complain about say about idols in our lives?
4. How long does it seem that Habakkuk was crying out to God? What would you tell someone who feels they cannot hear God?
5. How truthful are Habakkuk’s words in verses 2-4? Do you ever exaggerate or make false claims against God?
6. When we come to God, do we ever come perfect and with pure motives? Why is it important to come to God no matter how far our hearts are from him? Is prayer only about receiving what we ask for or is it about something more? Please explain.
7. What has happened to you that made you doubt God’s love? What has God done for you to prove his love?
8. Read Habakkuk 1:5-11. Do the words in verse 5 seem encouraging when you first read them?
9. What were the Babylonians like, according to verses 6-11? Why would God have them hurt his children?
10. The Lord said the Babylonians’ god was their own strength. How can success lead us away from God?
11. To what degree does it surprise you that God uses even the evil in our world to bring about his purposes?
12. How has God used his discipline or unjust suffering in your life to bless you? How have answers to prayer drawn you closer to the Lord?
13. In what ways do you need to seek and trust God in your circumstances this week?
