- 1. Share about a job or assignment you felt inadquate to perform. What was the outcome?
- 2. Read Luke 18:9-12. To whom was Jesus targeting this parable? Who might Jesus share this parable with today?
- 3. Describe how Pharisees and tax collectors were viewed by the Jewish community in Jesus' day. What motivated the Pharisee to pray? How do you feel about this religious guy?
- 4. Who was the Pharisee ultimately praising in his prayer? What would that prayer sound like in terms of a self-righteous person today? How important are outward appearances in our culture today? The church?

- 5. Read Luke 18:13-14. Compare and contrast the prayer of the tax collector with prayer of the Pharisee.
- 6. Why did the tax collector feel inadequate in this story? How can you relate to the tax collector?
- 7. Why did Jesus praise the tax collector and condemn the Pharisee? What difference did it make how these men prayed? How should that influence the way we pray?
- 8. Read Luke 18:15-17. Why would the disciples rebuke parents from bringing their babies to Jesus? Would you have rebuked the disciples like Jesus did? Why or why not?
- 9. How does Jesus treat children?
- 10. How has the view of children changed from 2000 years ago until today in the United States? How does God's view of babies differ from our culture's view today?
- 11. What does Jesus' response say about kids and us when it comes to approaching God? What childlike qualities do we need to cultivate in our lives?
- 12. What does it mean to, "Be confident in Jesus' work for you, not in your work for Jesus?" How will you commit to model/pursue humility this week?
