## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. In your view, how would you express the goal of Christian marriage?
2. Read Micah 6:8. What qualities in verse 8 sustain a godly marriage? How can applying this verse take the pressure off in marriage?
3. Read Ephesians 5:33. In summary, how does this verse speak to the responsibilities of the husband and wife toward each other?
4. Why would you say the phrase “you complete me” is a myth (or, at least a half truth)?
5. Read Ephesians 5:23-24. What are wives responsible to do for the Lord? How is submission an exercise of commitment and trust to Jesus?
6. Why do you think the concept of submission gets a bad rap in today’s culture?
7. Are there boundaries with regards to submission?
8. How could biblical submission lead to meeting the needs of a Christian husband?
9. Read verses 25-32. In v.25, how are husbands to love their wives? Why would this be a radical call in the first century? What does the husband’s sacrificial love look like in a marriage?
10. In verse 28-31 Paul says men are to love their wives like they love their own bodies. What does this presume? How can this idea motivate men?
11. Why would unselfishness be an essential part of a Christian marriage?
12. How does this passage challenge you personally in your journey with the Lord? What is something you can do to support the idea of Christian marriage/relationships?
