The Compromise Mark 15:1-15

- 1. What does the word "compromise" bring to mind? What was a positive compromise you have made in your life? What was a negative one you have made?
- 2. **Read Mark 15:1-5.** Look at the groups of people who arrested Jesus and brought him to Pilate. What did all of the groups have in common?
- 3. Did these groups impose their will upon Jesus? How was this part of Jesus' greater plan?
- 4. Why do you think Jesus did not give an answer to Pilate? What impact did that have on Pilate?
- 5. Read Mark 15:6-11. What was it about Jesus that intimidated the religious elite?
- 6. In what way does every Christ follower relate to Barabbas? Why is the name of Barabbas ("son of the father") so significant?
- 7. **Read Mark 15:12-15.** What do these verses tell us about the fallen condition of humanity? What lessons can we take from the reaction of the crowd (see also Mark 11:9-10)?
- 8. What was Pilate's chief goal? Why is it critical for Christians to not be swayed by popular opinion?
- 9. In what ways is the world tempting you to compromise when it comes to Jesus?
- 10. **Read John 19:1 and Isaiah 52:14.** What was flogging? Describe what flogging did to a human body.
- 11. **Read John 19:5-6.** What must have Jesus looked like? What condition must the hearts of the people have been to shout, "Crucify!"?
- 12. **John 19:10-11.** What does Jesus' response tell us about the sovereignty of God? How does God's sovereignty comfort you at a time like this?
