- Read 1 Corinthians 9:20. What does it mean to "become like a Jew?" What would have looked like for Paul to "live like one under the law?"

- 10. How does the mission of Westside "to connect this generation to Christ and his church" relate to Paul's passion to "save some?"
- 11. Read 1 Corinthians 9:23. What does it mean to share in the blessings of the gospel? What ways are we blessed when we sacrifice for the gospel?
- 12. How does this passage challenge us in the way we relate to our neighbors? What is your next step in relating to non-believers around you?
