DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. In what ways do people in the world today work to “look good” to other people? Why do we do try to portray ourselves in the best light possible to other people?
2. Read Exodus 20:4-6. Why would someone “carve” or “mold” an image and then worship it? Why would human beings think that something they produced is a god whom they should bow down to, worship and trust in to take care of them?
3. Why would an image never represent Almighty God accurately? As you read about the Lord in Scripture, what makes you uncomfortable about God?
4. The main point from Sunday’s sermon was, “Worship God for who he is, not for who you want him to be.” How would you explain this statement to someone who is not a Christ-follower?
5. Describe a time when you dealt with a person who was jealous? Is “jealous” generally considered a positive or negative trait in our world today?
6. What does God mean when he states that he is “a jealous God?”
7. Why would God punish children for the sin of the parents? Why would he bless children for what the parents have done?
8. Describe the contrast of the Lord punishing three to four generations of those who hate God, but loving a thousand generations of those who love God and keep his commandments (verse 6).
9. What are some “idols” that people have today? What is an “idol” in your life?
10. How can a healthy understanding of your “identity in Christ” help you to overcome your idolatry?
