DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What is one thing you have a tendency to complain about? Is there a difference in complaining and venting? Who do you vent to?
2. What words does Habakkuk use to describe God in Habakkuk 1:12? What is significant about these words?
3. Read verses 13. What question is Habakkuk struggling with? Have you ever asked this same question?
4. Read verses 14-17. What picture does Habakkuk use to describe the way God's people were being treated? Can you think of another time in history in which God's people were mistreated?
5. Habakkuk is deeply struggling with questions for God. Does God immediately answer his question in this passage? Why doesn't God immediately answer our questions?
6. What is a 'watch' in the context of Habakkuk 2:1? Has God appointed a specific 'watch' for you? Share with the group.
7. What is a 'rampart' (verse 2:1)? Why would Habakkuk choose to stand at the rampart versus all of the other places in the wall?
8. It's easy to think that waiting means doing nothing. Is it possible to actively wait on God? What does it look like to actively wait on God?
9. What is Habakkuk looking towards (verse 2:1). Why is this important for him? Why is this important for us?
10. A friend confides in you by sharing that they are in a season of waiting. What counsel would you give them? Is there any specific scripture you would share?
