## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. When have you failed to keep your word and it caused someone great pain?
- 2. In Luke 22, Jesus and his disciples partake of the Last Supper, where Christ foretells of his suffering and death, then the disciples argue among themselves. Read Luke 22:23-24. Why would the disciples argue about these issues rather than be humbled by Jesus' words? In what ways do we act like the disciples did?
- 3. Read Luke 22:31-34. What was Jesus telling Peter? What was Peter's reaction/promise? How are we like Peter?
- 4. Read Luke 22:39-46. As Jesus was in agony over what was to come, he asked the disciples to pray. How well did Peter and the guys do?

- 5. Jesus was arrested. Read about all of the disciples' boldness in Mark 14:50. How well did Peter and the rest of the disciples do in keeping their promise (see Matthew 26:35)?
- 6. Read Luke 22:54-62. Describe Peter's actions and reactions in this account. How can you relate to Peter?
- 7. Read John 21:15-22. Why did Jesus ask Peter three times if Peter loved him?
- 8. Why did Jesus push to ensure that Peter understood the gravity of what he did? How is it good parenting, teaching, and leadership to help others understand the weight of our sin?
- 9. What did Jesus say would happen to Peter? Why would Peter ask about what John's call was from Jesus?
- 10. What was Jesus' response to Peter about John's role in the kingdom? What do Jesus' words teach us?
- 11. Read Acts 2:41. Just weeks after Peter denied Jesus, the Holy Spirit came at Pentecost in Acts 2, then Peter preached and 3,000 became Christians. What does this say about the "do over" Peter was given?
- 12. How does Peter's story encourage you? What is God calling you to do in light of this study?
