- 3. Read Habakkuk 2:1-3. What is so hard about trusting God while we wait? When have you had to wait, only to eventually see God's purpose in retrospect?
- 4. How does waiting on the Lord help us to rely upon him more fully?

- Read Mark 13:32-33. Since we do not know when the end will come, or even when God will act, what does Jesus challenge us to do while we wait? What does this look like?
- 6. Read Habakkuk 2:4-12. What do these verses communicate about the result for those who do not obey the Lord? How can the Lord's warnings here motivate us to pursue his best?
- 7. Read Habakkuk 2:13-14. Where do you see promise in these verses? How do these verses encourage someone who is waiting on God?
- 8. Read Habakkuk 2:15-17. What does God promise the fate of the Babylonians, as well as though who practice wickedness, will be? What did happen to the Babylonians in the end? Why is it comforting that God brings justice upon the wicked?
- 9. Read Habakkuk 2:18-19. The Lord describes the ridiculousness of idols. What do you trust in more than God at times?
- 10. Read Habakkuk 2:20. Why does God go from rebuking idolatry to proclaiming that he is in his temple? What does it mean for the Lord to be in his temple both then and now?
- 11. How does Habakkuk 2:20 parallel Psalm 46:10 in meaning and application? Why would the Lord command, not recommend, for his people to be silent and still before him?
- 12. What is your next right step in experiencing stillness before the Lord? What are some worries and stressors that you have to let go of in order to experience the presence of God?
