- 10. Read Jeremiah 1:9-10. How encouraging would it have been for Jeremiah to have the Lord touch his lips and tell him that he is set apart to proclaim the very words of God? How has the Holy Spirit's work in your life overwhelmed you with a sense of divine purpose?
- 11. How is God directing you in building His kingdom? What keeps you from fulfilling God's call upon your life?
- 12. What do you need to do in order to more faithfully live out God's purpose for your life?
