The last two years have been challenging in many ways. Due to the covid situation, many countries closed doors for travel, thus affecting international ministry opportunities.

However, in 2021, we decided to start our international mission trips to Africa and Asia. My trip to Pakistan between October 20 and November 6 was fruitful. Through my visit, many heard the gospel in a Muslim-dominated country. In this PIPELINE, I will share more of the impact of this trip.

I take this opportunity to thank our partners for the overwhelming love, prayers, and financial support enabling me to undertake the trip, share the gospel, and help those in needy situations.

Your unreserved giving is not in vain. There is a great reward both here on earth and eternal life.

Early in the Summer, a team of six from the United States visited Kenya and Burundi. We preached in churches, conferences, crusades, trained pastors, built decent homes for pygmy families and toilets for the indigenous Maasai of Kenya. We also reached the youth through Soccer Tournament (Kingdom Cup). During the two months of mission trip, more than 300 people gave their lives to Jesus, and our teams are following up with phone calls, visits, and bible study groups. Keep the new believers in your prayers.

Your continued support significantly impacts lives, especially when we have increased needs among the people we serve. Without your continued support, this wouldn't be possible. REACHING THE MUSLIMS OF PAKISTAN WITH THE GOSPEL

Pakistan, officially the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, is located in South Asia. It is the world's fifth-most populous country, with a population exceeding 225 million, and its second-largest Muslim population after Indonesia. Muslims make about 97 percent of Pakistan's population.

In October 2021, Samuel traveled to Pakistan to preach in several cities between October 20 and November 6. More than 8,000 people heard the gospel, and 260 gave their lives to Christ. Thousands are hungry to hear the gospel.

We also gave Bibles, Commissioned Boreholes, ministered to the Indigenous people groups, and visited multiple Discipleship groups.

We are excited about the growth of the Discipleship Program in Pakistan. The Urdu translation is widely circulated in Pakistan. Pastor Victor, our staff, working with Pakistan churches, has initiated over ten bible study groups in four different regions.

The people of Pakistan are excited to have a discipleship book in their own language, which they can use for bible study. Their children help those who cannot read. The children read the book for them and study the Bible in the evenings.

As a result, many people are equipped with the Word to become disciple-makers.
