CONFESSION

SCRIPTURE READING: ISAIAH 7.1-2 and 10-17 7 In the days of Ahaz the son of Jotham, son of Uzziah, king of Judah, Rezin the king of Syria and Pekah the son of Remaliah the king of Israel came up to Jerusalem to wage war against it, but could not yet mount an attack against it. ²When the house of David was told, "Syria is in league with Ephraim," the heart of Ahaz and the heart of his people shook as the trees of the forest shake before the wind.

¹⁰ Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz: ¹¹ "Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." ¹² But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test." ¹³ And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. ¹⁵ He shall eat curds and honey when he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. ¹⁶ For before the boy knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land whose two kings you dread will be deserted. ¹⁷ The LORD will bring upon you and upon your people and upon your father's house such days as have not come since the day that Ephraim departed from Judah—the king of Assyria!"

PROCLAMATION SCRIPTURE READING: JOHN 17.13-17

¹³But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.

HEBREWS 4.11-13 (NASB)

- 11 Therefore let's make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one will fall by *following* the same example of disobedience.
- 12 For the word of God is living and active, and sharper than any two-edged sword, even penetrating as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.
- 13 And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him to whom we must answer.

SERMON NOTES I. <u>v.11-12; IF IT'S BY FAITH ALONE, THEN</u> <u>GOD KNOWS</u>

Q. We believe that we have peace with God by faith alone. That means we believe that God already sees us, in Christ, as perfect; His requirement for perfection met in Christ alone. What might you be doing that isn't by faith? Maybe something to impress God (and people) because you don't feel perfect? Is it concerning that God knows that you're either faking your faith or just don't understand how He loves you?

II. <u>v.13; OUR HOPE MUST BE BY FAITH</u> ALONE, BECAUSE WE'RE SO EXPOSED

Q. What does God know about you? What does reading the Bible convict you of? Do you typically hear God's voice as criticizing or comforting? How does the Gospel let you hear God's voice truly?

He took my sins and my sorrows He made them His very own He bore the burden to Calvary And suffered and died alone


When with the ransomed in glory His face I at last shall see 'Twill be my joy through the ages To sing of His love for me
