KEY TAKE AWAYS

Four Ways God Views Money:

- 1. Money is Important The Bible contains over 2,300 verses about money and possessions
- 2. Money is a Resource It's potential for kingdom impact, not self-indulgence
- 3. Money is a Test It reveals what we trust, value, and how we live
- 4. Money is a Trap The love of money is the root of all kinds of evil

Big Idea: How we view money reveals how we view God.

QUESTIONS

- 1. Of the four practical uses of money mentioned (daily needs, helping others, supporting the church, spreading the gospel), which one challenges you most? Why?
- 2. **Stewardship Check:** Do you view yourself more as an *owner* or a *manager* of your finances? What's the difference, and why does it matter?
- 3. The sermon used the analogy of seed that must be sown or stored. Are you currently sowing or

- storing the resources God has given you? What needs to change?
- 4. **Budget Reality Check:** "Your budget tells a story of what you value." If someone looked at your bank statement from the last month, what would they conclude you value most?
- 5. Read **Matthew 6:19–24.** Jesus says we cannot serve both God and money. What are practical signs that someone might be serving money instead of God?
- 6. Discuss the story of the **rich young ruler (Mark 10:17–22).** What "one thing" might be standing between you and a deeper relationship with God?

PRACTICE

This Week's Challenge:

Choose ONE of the following action steps to complete before your next meeting:

Option 1: Audit Your Spending

- Review your last month's transactions
- Categorize spending: needs, wants, giving, saving
- Ask yourself: Does this reflect my values and God's priorities?

Option 2: Take a Generosity Step

- Identify one specific need in your community, church, or mission field
- Prayerfully give toward meeting that need (even if it's small)
- Journal about how it felt to sow rather than store

Option 3: Prayer Progression

- Spend time in prayer moving from "God, bless me" to "God, use me to bless others"
- Ask God to reveal if money has become an idol in your life
- Write down what He shows you

Option 4: Community Action

- Visit the Walla Walla Valley Hunger Relief Coalition (8am-2pm, Mon-Fri)
- Donate food, supplies, or volunteer time
- Invite someone from your group to join you
