- Romans 1:19-20 For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown
 it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been
 clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So
 they are without excuse.

Discussion Questions

- Why do you think we long for God to speak to us like He used to speak prior to the coming of Christ and the closing of the canon or Scripture?
- Why is it critical for us to know that God still speak today through creation and His Word?
- In what specific ways does creation reveal the glory of God?
- How does creation speak to those outside of Christ, according to Romans 1:19-20?
- How does creation speak to the Christian and reinforce the nature and character of God?
- What is the impact of the four different words David uses to describe God's Word?
- What can you learn from David's high view of Scripture offered in verses 7-11?
- Why is it vital to realize that a high view of God's Word comes from a high view of God Himself rather than starting with trying to change one's view of Scripture?
- How does God revealing His glory in creation and Scripture connect to helping us better understand Christ and His work?
- What can you learn from the illustration of rock climbing with or without a harness in relation to the roll of the law of God?
- How does David's example in verses 12-14 show you what applying God's revelation to your life looks like?
- In what ways do verses 12-13 help highlight the magnitude of sin and how it can grow?
- How can you apply verse 14 to your life and incorporate it as part of your prayer life?
- In what ways does this text show you your need for Christ and encourage you to run to Him?
- How does this passage make you more thankful for God and His revealing of His glory through creation and His Word?
