- God's providence led a realtor in Hendersonville to suggest a particular location: a beautiful sixty-three acre estate, containing a massive home and the Heidelberg Gardens, for sale in Flat Rock. The location was perfect for the conference and was purchased on August 31, 1921.

 Shortly thereafter, a contest was held to select a name for the Assembly Grounds. Mrs. Sallie Miller Brice of Chester, SC Offered the following:
- I submit a name for our Assembly Grounds. It is Bon-clar-ken, and
 it has this meaning. Bon- from the Latin, bonus "good", -clar
 from the Latin clarus "clard", -ken from the Scotch "vision".
 Bon-clar-ken Good-clear-vision.
- Since 1921, Bonclarken has had a good, clear vision to serve as "a Christian environment for inspiration and renewal."

ERSKINE C O L L E G E

- Erskine College is located in Due West, a town of 1,200 residents located in historic Abbeville County, South Carolina, an area rich in colonial, Revolutionary War, and Coi/War history. The town and the college, with a number of artebellum buildings, are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. An annual spring resturbablings a large number of tourists to have in the cultural and historic heritage of the county. Erskine's spacious 90-acc engines provides both classic and modern facilities. The signature towers of the Fishine Building are complemented by a state-of-the-art-science facility and a new manic and muth education complete. - The College maintains sound and varied recreational and athletic programs. The college encourages sports activities among all students in a belief that participation in sport at the intercollegiate, intramural, or recreational level aids in the overall personal development of the individual.
- Erskine competes on the intercollegiate level as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II and as a member of Conference Carolinas.
- The College currently offers 23 sports: men's and women's basketball, golf, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, soccer, and volleyball; men's baseball and football; women's cross country, lacrosse, softball, and beach volleyball; cheer, dance, bass fishing, esports, and rodeo.

- Recruiting, assessing, resourcing, training, and supporting church planters who have been called and placed in the field by their Presbyteries
- \bullet Coaching, training, and equipping established churches to flourish in their communities
- Training and equipping Christians to share the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ



- World Witness is the foreign missions agency of the ARP Church. Our first missionaries were sent in 1875 to Mexico and Pakistan. Our fields have broadened to now include England, Germany, France, Lithuania, Spain, Wales and the SEED (Serve by Educating, Equipping, and Discipling church leaders) Ministry.
- This includes Christian Hospital Sahiwal in Pakistan, reaching 40,000 Pakistanis annually, and Christian schools in Pakistan, educating 700 students annually. In addition, satellite TV ministries are reaching into unreached areas in the Middle East.



- We are a connectional church.
- A portion of our annual budget goes to the Denominational Ministry Fund which helps fund the work of the ARP Denomination – including these Boards and Agencies. In 2024 the DMF received \$2.699 million. FARP gives \$91,000 to DMF plus other funds (\$54k) to WW for our missionaries.
- In addition to supporting the work of the denomination as a whole; we replicate likekind ministries here at First ARP.
 - Missions: RUF, Spain Mission Trip, Appalachia, Manna House Food Pantry, HOPE House, along with supporting multiple missionaries
 - Education: Preschool
