- Psalm 96:1-3 Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!
- Genesis 6-9 the flood
- Ezekiel 31:3 Behold, Assyria was a cedar in Lebanon.
- Mark 4:38 Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?
- Mark 4:39 And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
- Psalm 24:2 for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers.

- How does the thought of God being in charge of storms strike you?
- What does it mean to ascribe glory and strength to the Lord?
- Why is it important for us to remember that our minds are a critical part of worship?
- How does the fact that the word 'worship' means to submit one's will to God impact your approach to worship both at church and in everyday life?
- What are some practical things you can do to grow in your worship of the Lord?
- How does David's image of a powerful storm help you see the glory of God?
- In what ways does this passage teach that God alone is worthy of our worship?
- How can you use the truth of God's power over storms to comfort yourself or others in literal storms?
- How can you find comfort that God sits enthroned over the flood?
- Why is it that the storm in this passage can symbolize other storms of life?
- How does the fact that Jesus endured the greatest storm, the cross, give us hope?
- In what ways does Psalm 29 connect to Mark 4:35-41?
- What impact does God giving strength and peace give you in your day to day life?
- How does this passage grow your view of God?
- How does this passage show you your need for Jesus?
- What is one practical thing you can do differently in light of this passage and sermon?
