- Luke 1:38 Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word.
- Psalm 110:1 The Lord says to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool."
- Philippians 2:10-11 at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

- In what ways can singing help your joy whether you are in the choir or can't carry a tune in a bucket?
- How did 'fresh eyes' help you see this passage in a different way?
