Potluck with the Pastor is Next Sunday



4/23: Creating a Culture of Intentional Families

The scriptures tell us that what we do today directly influences the multi-generational cycle of family traits, beliefs and actions. Passing along a strong faith to the next generation begins by having a strong faith ourselves.

4/30: Intentional Families Begin with Single Adults

Whether you are called to the single life or hope to marry, as a single adult, you have distinct opportunities to grow in your faith and to make a substantial contribution to the kingdom.

5/7: Partnering with the Faith Community to Launch Young Adults

We've all heard the phrase "failure to launch" describing young men and women who don't make the transition from childhood to adult for one reason or another. How can you be intentional about successfully launching your older children?
