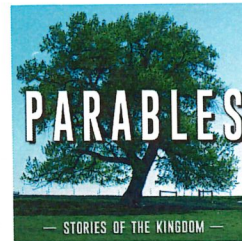

Knowing and doing and self-justification

Luke 10: 25-29

I. A new mind and a new heart is what we need to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Loving those who love me is something natural, loving our enemies is not.

“Those who followed their way and the one who set aside his way.”

Luke 10: 30-35

II. To love is to put the needs of a stranger in priority.

a) The three men on the road should have had their own affairs, but only one put them aside to help a stranger.

b) Someone who loves, has compassion, cares, accompanies in difficult times and if resources have to be spent, he does so.
