Sermonic Review

6 “Therefore we are always **confident, (good courage)** knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord:

While we are at home in this body we are away from the Lord.

7 “(for we walk by faith, not by sight:)

We live by the hope of our confident faith in God, not by our visual awareness.

8 Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord.

9 So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him.

- **Pauls personal preference is to be in heaven with Christ.**
- **Pauls personal pursuit whether he is present in the body and absent from God, he wants his life to be acceptable to God.**

My Parents often told us to be mindful of where we are from, and whom we are from when we leave home. In other words

you can't act one way at home and another way when you are away from the house. Ultimately you still have to come back to this house, and this is the place and we are the people who determine the fate of your judgement.
