

HIGHLIGHTS

Romans 8:28 *And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.* NIV

CONTEXT

1. Romans is Paul's longest and most significant letter.

2. Christians are suffering.

Romans 8:18 *I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.*

3. Creation is experiencing death and decay.

Romans 8:19 *The creation waits in eager expectation for the sons of God to be revealed. 20 For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the glorious freedom of the children of God.*

4. God is in control of His plan for redemption.

Romans 8:22 *We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. 23 Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the*

firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies.

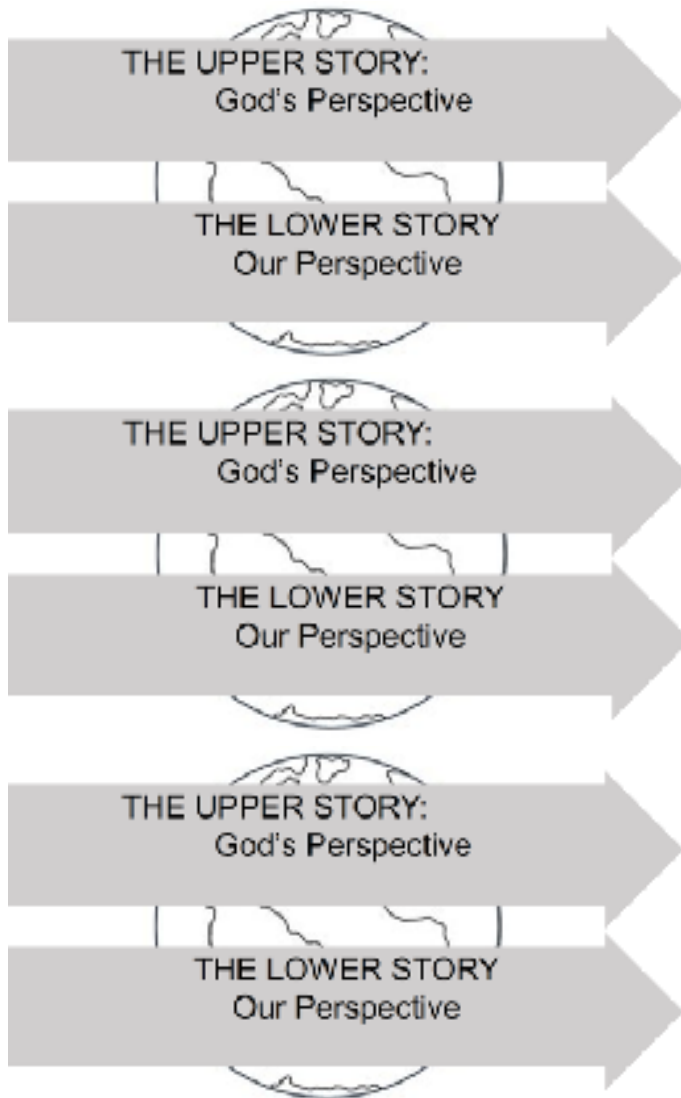
Romans 8:28 *And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.*

CARRY OUT

1. God will more than balance the books.

Romans 8:28 *And we know that in all things God works...*

3. We become more Christ like through our suffering than through our successes.

Romans 8:29 *For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son...*

4. God has an irrepressible purpose for our lives.

5. Nothing can separate us from the love of God.

Romans 8:38 *For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.*
