The celebration was creative.

Nehemiah 12:31 I had the leaders of Judah go up on top of the wall. I also assigned two large choirs to give thanks . . .

Nehemiah 12:38 The second choir proceeded in the opposite direction. I followed them on top of the wall, together with half the people . . .

Nehemiah 12:40 The two choirs that gave thanks then took their places in the house of God. . .

The celebration was thankful!

Nehemiah 12:27 At the dedication of the wall of Jerusalem, the Levites were sought out from where they lived and were brought to Jerusalem to celebrate joyfully the dedication with songs of thanksgiving and with the music of cymbals, harps and lyres.

The celebration was joyful!

Nehemiah 12:43 And on that day they offered great sacrifices, rejoicing because God had given them great joy. The women and children also rejoiced. The sound of rejoicing in Jerusalem could be heard far away.

The celebration was loud!

Nehemiah 12:43 ... The sound of rejoicing in Jerusalem could be heard far away.

The celebration was transforming!

Nehemiah 12:43 And on that day they offered great sacrifices, rejoicing because God had given them great joy . . .
