4. What wisdom would Jesus give to those who are dealing with an empty chair? What do you think Jesus means by rest?

5. What does the Apostle Paul mean when he says we should grieve not as the world grieves? In this context, what does Paul mean by hope? How should we as Christians comfort others faced with an ongoing empty chair?
