

2 Samuel 12 Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

David was a man after God's own heart not because he was perfect, but because he <u>confessed</u> his sin when he wasn't.

Psalm 51:1-2 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

Confession begins by appealing to the mercy of God.

Psalm 51: 3-4 For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge.

Confession means that you take full <u>responsibility</u> that you were the one that had done wrong.

Psalm 51: 5-6 Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. Yet you desired faithfulness even in the womb; you taught me wisdom in that secret place.

Confession means you remember the origin of sin is <u>hereditary.</u>

Psalm 51: 7-9 Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice. Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity.

Confession means you ask for God to <u>cleanse</u> your heart.

Psalm 51:10-15 Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you. Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, you who are God my Savior, and my tongue will sing of your righteousness. Open my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise.

Confession communicates your desire to have your relationship with God be <u>restored.</u>

Psalm 51:16-17 You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. My sacrifice, O god, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise.

Confession only works when your heart is broken.

God delights in our words of repentance because our relationship with God <u>begins</u> and <u>grows</u> with confession of sin.
