Reviving Boldness in the Church

Vision for 2026 and Spiritual Readiness

- The meeting opened with a call for excitement and readiness for the coming year (2026), with gratitude expressed for past blessings and an emphasis on seeking God's direction for the church.
- Prayer was offered for guidance, truth, and the church's continued growth.

Concerns About Modern Church Trends

- The speaker reflected on conversations with other Christians and young ministers, expressing concern over trends in contemporary churches, especially the diminishing significance of traditional practices like baptism.
- Observed that some churches are adopting worldly behaviors and aesthetics, potentially compromising core values for the sake of attracting more attendees or financial security.
- Noted specific examples such as casual attitudes toward sacred rituals and the serving of snacks during services, questioning whether such changes dilute the church's spiritual impact.

Key Points

- The importance of maintaining reverence and core spiritual

practices in church.

- The need to resist conforming to societal trends that undermine biblical teachings.
- The danger of covetousness and comparison, both individually and as a congregation.

The Call to 'Pesky Prophets'

- The sermon referenced the biblical story of Ahab, Jezebel, and Naboth's vineyard (1 Kings 21), using it as a metaphor for standing firm against moral compromise.
- Encouraged members to be like Elijah—"pesky prophets"—who are unafraid to confront sin and uphold truth, even if it is uncomfortable or unpopular.
- Emphasized the importance of personal prayer, Bible study, and spiritual leadership within families as protection against spiritual attack.

Decisions and Action Plans

- The church is called to:
 - Stand firm in biblical truth and not compromise for acceptance or popularity.
 - Boldly but lovingly confront sin and encourage repentance.
 - Rely on the Holy Spirit for guidance and boldness in sharing the gospel.
- Members are urged to:
 - Guard their families spiritually through prayer and vigilance.
 - Participate actively in small groups and discipleship opportunities.
 - Be proactive in sharing their faith, trusting that people are

receptive.

Personal Testimonies and Encouragement

- Shared testimonies of individuals leading others to faith in everyday circumstances, highlighting openness to the gospel and the need for boldness.
- Encouraged the congregation to view every day as an opportunity to make an eternal impact and not to fear offending others when sharing the truth in love.

Closing Prayer and Invitation

- The meeting ended with a prayer for boldness and a renewed commitment to being distinctively Christian and kingdom-minded.
- The altar was opened for prayer, and members were invited to continue their spiritual growth through upcoming discipleship events.
